



Since our beginning in October 2000, we have developed an effective and successful model of care, enabling us to make a difference in the lives of hundreds of orphans with special needs. Building on our proven experience, we now want to expand our efforts geographically to reach more children in the densely populated provinces of southern China. We see an enormous opportunity to develop relationships with new orphanages in the region, partnering with them to care for their children, and a physical presence in the area will help us make the most of this opportunity.

## Who We'll Serve

An extension of New Day Foster Home in Beijing, New Day South shares the same mission and operational model. Whereas our Beijing operation helps orphaned children mostly from northern and central China, New Day South will focus on helping children from eight of China's southern provinces. With an estimated 60 percent of China's orphanages concentrated in these provinces, we see a great need in the region.

## Where We'll Go

With some of south China's best hospitals and proximity to world class medical care in Hong Kong for the more complex medical needs that may arise, the city of Guangzhou in Guangdong province provides an ideal base for our new operation. We have identified a small community just south of Guangzhou with a good environment for the children to live, ready access to transportation systems and hospitals, and modest operating costs.











# How We'll Help

We will provide life-saving medical intervention and a loving home to live and grow for orphans with special needs from China's southern provinces. We will do all we can to see each child placed in an adoptive family of his or her own. And, we will work closely with government orphanages in the region to find practical ways to assist them in caring for their children.

## How We'll Start

After finding a suitable facility, a core management team from New Day Foster Home in Beijing will relocate to Guangzhou. They will oversee the outfitting of the new home and begin recruiting local caregiver and medical staff. We will provide regular project status updates on our website.

## What We Need

We need financial supporters who will help us bring hope and healing to more of China's orphans. Our start-up costs will be approximately \$30,000 USD, consisting mostly of facility, equipment and travel costs. To operate the home for the first 12 months, we need approximately \$80,000 USD, not including medical and surgical expenses.
